HICKORY MUSEUM OF ART 2021/2022 Field Trip & Teacher's Guide





Experience an art-filled, educational year of activities for your students where the birth of a creative thought becomes a tangible object. HMA offers your students interactive, engaging tours that test their observation skills, critical thinking, and expression of ideas. Tours support the N.C. Common Core and Essential Standards.

PRE-K: Art Exploration

Young students tour the gallery in search of shapes, colors and patterns. Tours incorporate stories and simple gallery games.

Optional art activity: Will vary depending on the gallery focus.

K-1st GRADE: Families

Learn about different kinds of families through various pieces of art. What makes a person part of your family? How is your neighbor different from your family? Do family members have to live together to be part of your family? Hear a story about families.

Optional Art Activity: Students will draw their family. After the drawing is complete, they will then use watercolors to fill them in.

2nd-3rd GRADE: Living In A Community

Utilizing HMA's Discover Folk Art exhibit, students observe, compare, and contrast life in different communities. Discussing, listening, and speaking skills are all a part of the tour. A story intro-duces the folk art exhibit.

Optional Art Activity: Create self-portraits along with descriptive writing.



4th GRADE: Our State

Students start their tour with a discussion about the three regions of NC. Afterwards, they are challenged to find artwork depicting these regions. Discussion on artistic traditions, use of natural resources and the importance of technology in NC are the focus.

Optional Art Activity: Students use collage techniques to create a paper face jug.

5th GRADE: Patriotism

Begin with a scavenger hunt in search of patriotic symbols within the artwork. Discussion explores what the symbols represent, as well as the roles of women and minorities in the artwork and how these roles have changed.

Optional Art Activity: Statue of Liberty.

6th-8th GRADE: Every Picture Tells A Story

Language Arts is the focus for middle school art programs. Tours include gallery introduction and exploration, along with a poem writing activity. Students work in groups to tell stories and discuss

art. Active listening, speaking, and analyzing skills are utilized.

The Improvisational Quilts of Susana Allen Hunter October 2, 2021 – February 6, 2022

For much of their lives, Susana Hunter and her husband Julius made their living farming, growing crops such as cotton, corn and potatoes. Wilcox County, Alabama, also home to the quilting community of Gee's Bend, was among the very poorest counties in the U.S. Susana Hunter's genius lies in creating beautiful, functional objects from what little was available.


3rd-4th Grade | Quilts & Communities October 2, 2021 - February 6, 2022

We'll explore Susana Allen Hunter's innovative way of creating quilts from what was available to her. Traditions, social structure and artistic expression will all be discussed. Special art activity to take home is also included.
